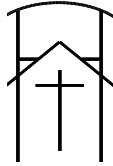

Compline ... or night prayer gives the opportunity to conclude the day sharing with others in quiet worship and prayer. This will now take place monthly, on the second Saturday of each month, meeting at 9.00 - 9.30 pm in the Parish Room (ie 11th February, 11th March, 8th April etc).

Monday Group ... the next meeting will be held on 13th February at 7.30 pm in Room 2 at St Peter's. The speaker will be Helen Farmer "Putting Carers First" – an informal talk about the work of carers. Visitors always welcome.

Afternoon Tea ... you are invited to our next Afternoon Tea on Tuesday, 14th February, in St Andrew's Church Hall, from 3.30 pm to about 5.00 pm. Youth Worker Appeal ... we are very grateful to those who have responded - both existing donors who have increased their giving, and also a good number of new supporters. Regular pledged giving has increased significantly from £16,000 to £19,400. With some one-off gifts also being received, this secures the post until at least the second half of 2018. If there are any who have not yet responded but are able to do so, leaflets are available near to the back of church.

Revd Alison Anderson ... as you will be aware Revd Alison Anderson will be retiring and leaving the Circuit at the end of February. The Circuit is organising a retiring collection for her, if you would like to contribute towards this could you please send your contribution to the Circuit Office by Friday, 17th February.

The Northern Men's Convention ... this year is on Saturday, 6th May at St Andrew's Leyland, near Preston, and is titled "Men, how should we Live? - To the Glory of God Alone". The Principle speaker will be Michael Reeves, President and Professor of Theology at Union School of Theology in Oxford. This is a great opportunity for the men in our congregations to get together, hear from well-known excellent speakers and enjoy singing rousing songs! Doors open at 9.00 am and the Convention starts at 10.00 am so we will need to leave around 8.00 am, to allow for traffic on the M6! We will finish at 4.45 pm and hope to be home soon after 6.00 pm. A group will be attending from St Andrew's and transport can be arranged. Tickets can be ordered in advance for £12.50 before 28th February (£15 at the door) Alan Swanborough will make a block booking in February. Newcastle Foodbank ... are still looking to fill two significant volunteer roles: one person responsible for fundraising, another for PR & Communications. For full details or to register interest contact Susie Dean at volunteering@newcastlestaffs.foodbank.org.uk
Also at the moment there is a current shortage of toiletries, particularly shampoo and men's toiletries (deodorant, shaving gel etc).

St Andrew's Pew Rearrangement ... this more modest reconfiguration is being trialled for a couple of months initially - with the next PCC's meeting on 27th March deciding whether to consider this kind of arrangement longer term.

Other PCC News ...though a variety of views were expressed, there was a strong majority in favour of further work to firm up the feasibility and costs of replacing our present hall with an extension to the church. The buildings development committee were authorised to engage a surveyor to formally advise on the likely proceeds of selling part of our site. If the outcome of this is positive, the committee were asked to proceed to appointing an architect to work with us on the design, permissions and likely cost of an extension.

With the Church of England Bishops and General Synod continuing to consider permitting the blessing of same-sex relationships, the PCC discussed this issue. Again a variety of views were expressed, but a strong majority agreed with the vicar's proposal to communicate our concerns about this development to our new Bishop by endorsing a letter produced nationally in October 2016 that can be found on <http://www.eggscofe.org.uk>.

Vicar's Vestry Carpet ... we need to replace the very worn carpet in the Vicar's vestry for safety reasons.
