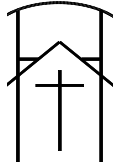

Youth Worker Appeal ... we are very grateful to those who have responded - both existing donors who have increased their giving, and also a good number of new supporters. Regular pledged giving has increased significantly from £16,000 to £19,400. With some one-off gifts also being received, this secures the post until at least the second half of 2018. If there are any who have not yet responded but are able to do so, leaflets are available near to the back of church.

The Northern Men's Convention ... this year is on Saturday 6th May at St Andrew's Leyland, near Preston, and is titled "Men, how should we Live? - To the Glory of God Alone". The Principle speaker will be Michael Reeves, President and Professor of Theology at Union School of Theology in Oxford. This is a great opportunity for the men in our congregations to get together, hear from well-known excellent speakers and enjoy singing rousing songs! Doors open at 9.00 am and the Convention starts at 10.00 am so we will need to leave around 8.00 am, to allow for traffic on the M6! We will finish at 4.45 pm and hope to be home soon after 6.00 pm. A group will be attending from St Andrew's and transport can be arranged. Tickets can be ordered in advance for £12.50 before 28th February (£15 at the door) Alan Swanborough will make a block booking in February. Fired Up Theatre with Sanctus St Mark's ... present award-winning play Mausoleum: Chaos and Claustrophobia, Pathways to Light on Wednesday, 1st February, 7.30 pm. Refreshments from 7.00 pm. The play enters into the frightening and fallow mind of a group of refugees and migrants living side by side, head to toe in a container and on the sea somewhere around the English coast. Stacked and breathless, journey into their world of oppression, physical abuse, fear, faith, hope and love. All proceeds will go to Sanctus' work with asylum seekers and refugees. St Andrew's Pew Rearrangement ... this more modest reconfiguration is being trialled for a couple of months initially - with the next PCC's meeting on 27th March deciding whether to consider this kind of arrangement longer term.

Other PCC News ...though a variety of views were expressed, there was a strong majority in favour of further work to firm up the feasibility and costs of replacing our present hall with an extension to the church. The buildings development committee were authorised to engage a surveyor to formally advise on the likely proceeds of selling part of our site. If the outcome of this is positive, the committee were asked to proceed to appointing an architect to work with us on the design, permissions and likely cost of an extension.

With the Church of England Bishops and General Synod continuing to consider permitting the blessing of same-sex relationships, the PCC discussed this issue. Again a variety of views were expressed, but a strong majority agreed with the vicar's proposal to communicate our concerns about this development to our new Bishop by endorsing a letter produced nationally in October 2016 that can be found on <http://www.eggscfe.org.uk>.

Vicar's Vestry Carpet ... we need to replace the very worn carpet in the Vicar's vestry for safety reasons.
