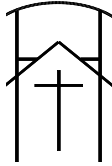

Lent Course ... "These Truths Alone" Looking at 5 'solos' which summarise key principles of reformation thought and spirituality. Youth and Children's Worker ... The Management Committee did not feel able to appoint either of the 2 candidates we interviewed, and have been encouraged by the Diocesan Youth Advisor to take stock before re-advertising. This could end up with our retaining something very similar to the current job description focussing on work with 7-18's; although another obvious possibility could be to refocus the post on work with children (0-11's) and families. Life Explored is a seven session series featuring a combination of short films - shot around the world - and Bible interaction. Foodbank is also looking to recruit a dedicated Project Lead to oversee its day to day operation locally and be an inspirational PR and fundraising lead. The role initially is for a fixed term contract of up to 2 years (with a view to this being extended) with a starting salary of £7,800 per annum for 15 hours per week. The ideal candidate will have previous knowledge of Foodbanks and experience within the voluntary sector although not essential. However they will need to share the Foodbank vision to tackle poverty.
