PCC News ...

The PCC voted by a very strong majority that when anticipated extra funds are available we will commission our architect to seek to obtain planning permission for the approach presented recently of replacing our ageing hall with a new hall integrated with the church building on the south side of the site. This was encouraged by the fact that over 2/3 of the responses from church members indicated this as their preferred option. We have also collated the suggestions made for adjustments to the design, and our next meeting will be considering which ones to ask the architect to implement.

Chris Gill will shortly be completing his term as our treasurer after many years of dedicated service. This means that we are now urgently looking for somebody with finance skills to serve in this way. Please do speak to Andrew if you might be willing to consider this.

St Andrew's Annual Meeting ... will take place at 6.30 pm on Sunday, 22nd April. We need to elect 15 members of the PCC (Parochial Church Council) for 2018-19. There are nomination forms at the back of church for those who are willing to stand for these posts; also to serve as our two church wardens for the next 12 months; and an additional sheet for any who would like to volunteer to join the sidesperson's rota.
