**Christian Aid Week: 13<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> May**... theme: 'God's Kingdom is stronger than storms'. We are very grateful to those who have been collecting regularly over the years. We are also mindful that some people would be quite happy to deliver envelopes but not to collect and we tried this on an experimental basis last year. A note is delivered with each envelope - encouraging people to give either by donating online or placing a cheque (but can be money) in the envelope and putting it through the door of one of our two homes. We would like to extend this scheme this year so that all streets are covered by some means and it would also be good to have some more drop-off points so that individuals don't have to travel too far to deliver their envelope.
