**Transgender Guidance and the CofE** ... this is a growing issue in our society, which is given an even greater prominence in the media. Interestingly, whilst almost all of the secular voices that were heard a couple of years ago represented an overwhelmingly positive perspective, in recent months a far wider range of complications and convictions and are apparent. The CofE bishops recently reacted to this subject by publishing some guidance on adapting another service to mark a person's gender transition. A rather different perspective - which appears to me to engage rather better with the complexities of the issues involved - has recently been published by the evangelical alliance and is available by googling 'EA transformed'. A couple of recent conversations has made me aware that this is an issue which touches a good number

of families; and as with any pastoral issue I am very happy to meet with any who would find it helpful: to listen; to pray together; and if needed to signpost specialist resources – Andrew.

**St Andrew's Medical Emergencies During Worship** ... we are very grateful to all who have assisted on a number of occasions during the past year. To help us in future:

- Church members whose health is uncertain are invited to consider completing a 'key health details and contact' card (available at the back of church) - aiming to bring it with them in their wallet or purse when attending services.
- Any regular worshippers with current first aid training are asked to email or ring me confirming their willingness to be listed as possible sources of help in an emergency.
- If there is ever a need to evacuate the building, worshippers are asked to comply with this request promptly.

- Wisdom. CAP clients face challenging circumstances often involving more than financial difficulties. Pray that Rob Kellett, the Centre Manager, and his team have the wisdom to help effectively but also direct/signpost clients to other church ministries or state services where appropriate.
- Obstacles. Recently some clients have struggled to keep CAP appointments. This can happen for many reasons. Please pray that nothing would stop them accessing the help they need.
