**St Andrew's Grass Cutting** ... we are grateful for our team of grass-cutters, and are looking for an extra volunteer, either to provide occasional cover, or to help on a more regular basis. For more details, speak to Alan Swanborough or the vicar.

## St Andrew's Building Development ...

- We have received a broadly positive report from the Diocesan Advisory Committee, and our architect has been asked to work up our proposals to enable a planning application to be made this autumn. We have taken on board some of this feedback and suggestions received following the presentation to the congregation at the beginning of 2018: the PCC deciding on a predominantly brick exterior, with the proposed location and design of the building otherwise largely unchanged.
- Though we will not be launching a formal appeal until all of the necessary approvals have been granted, the PCC has decided to set up two related funds to enable any who want to give towards the project to do so from now on:
  - a) Planning fund. Though the PCC has already allocated funds for this, gifts will be used to cover any additional costs that need to be incurred to take the project forward from our current position to completion (including construction costs). If the project is unable to proceed, then any unused gifts to this fund will be transferred to our general fund, and will not be refundable.

b) Construction fund. Gifts will only begin to be used when construction of a new hall is underway. If this does not happen by 2025, donors will be eligible to have their gift returned, if they wish.

Donations by cash or cheque, can be given via the collection plate. Regular givers can use a plain envelope marked 'Planning' or 'Construction'; and, assuming that your total charitable giving for the year is less than the amount of income tax that you will pay - please also write your gift aid number on the envelope. Alternatively one of the pre-printed envelopes in the pews can be used, with additional wording to indicate which fund the gift is to be allocated to. As with any other one-off gifts, you can also instruct your bank to transfer funds to our church account – although you will also need to contact our treasurer Steve Forrester confirming that the sum transferred is intended for either the planning or the construction fund; and whether or not it is eligible for gift-aid. If you have not given by this method before, he can also let you know the church bank details.

A Time for Silence and Contemplation ... do you find that your life is more Martha than Mary? Is that possibly what stops you getting closer to God? Then join us for a time of quiet contemplative prayer in the old Circuit Office, Newcastle Methodist Church and experience the use of silence as a way of going deeper with God; as a way of reflecting on your journey and as a way of listening to God. Church of England Communion Practices and Infection ... the medical advice is that the use of alcoholic wine, combined with careful wiping of the cup, means that the risk of transmitting infection to other recipients is minimal. In the past those with known infections have sometimes been encouraged to receive the wine by intinction (retaining the wafer to dip in the cup). These days, however this is not generally recommended, as an infected person's hands may well contain even more germs. Those with a real concern about infecting others are encouraged instead just to receive the wafer - as Cof E teaching has always been that the grace of receiving the sacrament is not dependent on receiving in both kinds. Those who wish to continue, on occasions, to practice intinction are not barred from doing so; but are asked to be among the very last to come for communion, as the dipping of a wafer in the cup can transmit gluten to those with coeliac disease who subsequently drink from it.
