Geoff Annas, Bishop of Stafford ... has announced his retirement. A farewell service to celebrate the good things happening across North Staffordshire in churches and their communities, and to express our thanks to Geoff and his wife Ann, will be held in Stoke Minster on Sunday, 24th November at 4.00 pm.

Church of England Communion Practices and Infection ... the medical advice is that the use of alcoholic wine, combined with careful wiping of the cup, means that the risk of transmitting infection to other recipients is minimal. In the past those with known infections have sometimes been encouraged to receive the wine by intinction (retaining the wafer to dip in the cup). These days, however this is not generally recommended, as an infected person's hands may well contain even more germs. Those with a real concern about infecting others are encouraged instead just to receive the wafer - as Cof E teaching has always been that the grace of receiving the sacrament is not dependent on receiving in both kinds. Those who wish to continue, on occasions, to practice intinction are not barred from doing so; but are asked to be among the very last to come for communion, as the dipping of a wafer in the cup can transmit gluten to those with coeliac disease who subsequently drink from it.

Action for Children ... Marion and Carol Reddish would like to thank everyone who over the years has supported Action for Children so well. We would want this good work to continue and so if you feel you could have a house collection box to put your loose change in we would be very pleased to hear from you. It is surprising how quickly small amounts of loose change on regular basis mount up, so please think about supporting this Methodist organisation.
