Gifts given at St Peter's will be passed on to Tri Alpha (Action for Children). Gifts for teenagers would be very welcome. Please see Joe, Val or Marion if you cannot come on that Sunday but would like to contribute a gift.

Gifts given at St Andrew's will be passed on to Elizabeth House refuge who work with families experiencing domestic violence and abuse. They have particularly asked for donations of: women toiletries, sanitary products, toys, gifts suitable for teenagers, small decorations/items for houses to help somebody make their house a home, gloves, hats and scarfs (or donations of money, in an envelope marked 'Arch - Elizabeth House'). Please bring items along to the services at 10.30 am on 8th December, or leave them at the back of St Andrew's in the week beforehand (the building is open Monday-Thursday 9.00 am - 3.00 pm).

Mental Health First Aid Awareness Course. We are offering an introductory course covering • What mental health is and how to challenge stigma • a basic knowledge of some common mental health issues • an introduction to looking after your own mental health and maintaining wellbeing (though obviously this kind of course will not be able to give attention to participants' specific problems), and • confidence to support someone in distress or who may be experiencing a mental health issue. The course will take place in the Parish Room on Saturday, 11th January from 10.00 am - 2.30 pm, including a half hour break for lunch. There will be a mix of presentations, group discussions and workshop activities, delivered by Gary Peake who offers similar training to local companies. Prayer Chain ... for many years St Andrew's and St Peter's have operated a prayer chain. It is intended for pressing needs (major medical problems or emergency, job interview, bereavement, family crisis etc). The chain aims to communicate promptly with a small group (currently 12) who are committed to pray for the situation. If you would value this kind of prayer support at any point, please do speak to one of the ministers, who are responsible for initiating prayer chain requests.

In addition, the Ecumenical Exec has agreed that we open up the prayer chain to up to 6 extra members. Members of either congregation who are willing to make a commitment to pray for others' needs in this way, and are willing to maintain confidentiality, are encouraged to speak to Andrew or John. From the new year, members of the chain will have the choice of receiving information either by email or telephone.

Identity Course ... *Who is God? Can I make contact with Him? Who are we? What is the purpose of life?* We have run this course several times over the last couple of years and are beginning to think about doing so again. Each week includes a discussion starter on DVD, with opportunity for interaction and questions. Ideal for anyone wanting to know more about the Christian faith, or looking for a refresher course.
