Church of England Communion Practices and Infection ... recently issued government and C of E medical advice continues to be that use of alcoholic wine, combined with careful wiping of the cup, means that the risk of transmitting infection to other recipients is minimal. However, those with coughs and sneezes are encouraged to refrain from handshaking during The Peace, and also to receive just the wafer - as C of E teaching has always been that the grace of receiving the sacrament is not dependent on receiving in both kinds. (Intinction -retaining the wafer to dip in the cup - is no longer recommended). All are also encouraged to practice general good hygiene, including regular handwashing with soap and hot water, and in addition alcohol-based hand sanitiser will be available at the back of church.

Fairtrade Fortnight is Now in Full Swing ... with the encouragement to adopt the habit of buying fairly traded goods as much as possible. The Newcastle group invite you to a chocolate tasting at the Guildhall next Saturday (7th March) between 11am – 2.00 pm.

Being a Happy Human Child in the 21st Century ... half-day seminar delivered by The Children's Society's Head of Youth Engagement Jim Davies on Wednesday, 25th March, 10.30 am – 1.00pm. Drawing on evidence from a decade of research into children's wellbeing and listening to young people express their own views about mental health, this seminar will inform, challenge and equip. The charity's drop-in services for young people in the Diocese give an insight to what young people struggle with and find helpful in overcoming their fears and worries. Keys to Unlocking Life with Dementia ... a training morning to help individuals and churches wanting to support people with dementia on Saturday, 7th March, 10.00 am – 12.30 pm (coffee from 9.30 am) at St Matthias Church, Hanford, ST4 4QB. Topics include: The keys to understanding dementia; The things that help a person with dementia; The things that don't help; The spiritual life of the person with dementia; All that caregiving involves; Avoiding dementia caregiver syndrome; The best support that individuals and churches can give. The two speakers are from Pilgrims' Friend Society – a 212 year old Christian charity supporting older people: a cognitive behavioural therapist and a former GP with personal experience of dementia who lectures widely on the subject.
