Keele Chapel GAIA Art Installation ... Luke Jerram's GAIA is visiting from November 6th - 28th. It's a 6 meter model of our planet, featuring detailed NASA imagery of the Earth's surface, and floating in three-dimensions. The installation creates a sense of the Overview Effect, something astronauts often experience as they look down on the Earth from space. In light of the current COVID-19 pandemic, GAIA may give the viewer a new perspective of our place on the planet, reminding us how precious it is and that we all have a responsibility to protect it for future generations. A specially made surround sound composition by

BAFTA award winning Composer Dan Jones is played alongside the sculpture.

At 7pm on Sunday 7th November the chaplaincy are using this as opportunity for a service focused on COP26 - at which they would very much welcome local church people. Revd Christine Polhill is the preacher.

There will be a full programme of other events, including lectures and concerts in the weeks that follow, and the chapel will be open to visitors for much of this period too. More details will appear on www.appetite.org.uk which also includes a short video introducing the project.
