This Week's Homegroups ... are the last before Christmas. The series on Mission will resume in the new year, meeting on 11th/12th/13th January; 25th/26th/27th January (for prayer) and 8th/9th/10th February, Ash Wednesday is on Wednesday 2nd March, and we will work out what the pattern for Lent meetings is nearer the time when the Covid situation is clearer.

Link Deliveries ... if you usually help with regular deliveries and are okay to do so, these will hopefully be ready on Sunday to collect from your folder at the back of church. As well as being open for Sunday services, the building is also open for collection in between 9.45 am - 10.30 am on Sunday and on Mondays & Thursdays 9.30 am -3.00 pm.

Faith in the Future Update ... marketing of our old church hall site is due to begin next week. We hope to be able to have offers for the land firmed up in mid April, at around the same time that we should be receiving tender prices for the new building - and these 2 key figures will tell us whether or not we have the finances to proceed with the project. We are hoping that we will be able to exchange contracts with a significantly delayed completion date to enable us to minimise the time that we are without hall facilities. However, this will depend on an offer

being made at a good price by a buyer that is willing to accept this condition.

Though some significant extra fee costs have recently become apparent, we have been very encouraged by some additional gifts and pledges, including a £10,000 grant offer from the Bernard Sunley Foundation - this brings the total of gifts or pledges to £269,735.
